BRAZIL HAS SIGNALED WTO AGREEMENT TO NEGOTIATE VACCINE PATENT SUSPENSION

The Brazilian government has said for the first time that it accepts to negotiate and stresses that it will seek "tangible results" in the shortest possible time frame. Brazil on Tuesday announced at the World Trade Organization (WTO) that it is ready to start negotiating on the proposed patent suspension during the Covid-19 pandemic. <u>Read more.</u>

COVID-19: MAP SHOWS 'EXTREMELY HIGH' TRANSMISSION ACROSS MOST OF BRAZIL

Based on data from SIVEP-Gripe, the Ministry of Health's Epidemiological Surveillance Information System on Influenza, and corrected estimates, researchers observed the growth in the number of hospitalizations for SARS (Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome) by date of first symptoms and found that in the week starting June 7, community transmission of the virus is "extremely high" in all states, except for Roraima and Espírito Santo. <u>Read more.</u>

BRAZIL LAGGING BEHIND IN PANDEMIC, GRIPPED BY FEAR – RESEARCH

The research surveyed Brazilians' expectations of the pandemic's side effects, reaching a scenario it described as a "double crisis of mental health and unemployment." The vast majority of Brazilians (90%) say they are still "thinking as if they were in the pandemic," compared to 65% of Germans, 56% of Americans, and 35% of Chinese.
